

### RYE-BASED EFFORTS TO HELP OTHERS - UPDATE


If you're feeling healthy and safe, and are eager to find a way to HELP OTHERS during this unsettling time, we have three simple, Rye-based efforts that could really use your help!

- RPC Church Member, Molly Howson, has started a campaign to raise funds for the purpose of providing much needed Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to frontline healthcare workers in New York City, Westchester County, NY and Greenwich, CT. Over the past few weeks Molly has raised over \$37,000 and purchased over 7,000 pieces of PPE, including masks, face shields, goggles, disposable hazmat suits, gowns, gloves and sanitizer. These supplies have gone to more than 15 hospitals and nursing homes as well as local EMS/FD/PD.

The Mission and Outreach Committee invites you to join your fellow disciples of Rye Presbyterian Church in the 2020 Sesquicentennial Service Challenge!




