



EMPTY BOWLS IS BACK - May 22!



Open Door midwives deliver over 400 babies a year. The majority of our patients live at or below the federal poverty level. They struggle with inadequate housing, food insecurity, low health literacy and cultural/language barriers.

The Baby Bundle provides Open Door prenatal patients with basic newborn essentials: diapers, wipes, onesies, hats, mittens, socks, bib, thermometer, and seasonal clothes.

Addressing systemic health problems takes more than a simple bundle. All women who deliver their babies with Open Door are supported by a Patient Advocate who provides prenatal information, postnatal support, nutrition and wellness guidance, and access to insurance benefits.




