Olivier Messiaen (1908-1992)

Messiaen wrote his 18-movement Livre du Saint-Sacrement (Book of the Blessed Sacrament) for the 1986 National Convention of the American Guild of Organists. This movement, the "Prayer before Communion" juxtaposes snippets of the plainsong melody associated with Lauda Sion (a lengthy Communion hymn written in 1294 by Thomas Aquinas) with Messiaen's compositional tonal language, known as "Modes of Limited Transposition." Messiaen was organist of La Trinité in Paris from 1931 until his death.




All that is spectacular, all that is plain have their origin in you; all that is lovely, all who are loving point to you as their fulfillment.

NEW MEMBER WELCOME DISCUSSIONS






In recent years our congregation and community has experienced several We have offered a variety of suicides. programing in response these heartbreaking events. We encourage vou to attend the 11/2 hour Soul Shop for Congregations workshop this fall. workshop will be offered twice, on Sunday, Oct. 23, and on Tuesday evening, Oct. 25, but you only attend one of the sessions. This workshop will be led by John Miller and Jean-Paul Marshall.

Soul Shop for Congregations has three objectives:

1) Familiarize participants with the incidence and impact of suicidal desperation on the adults and youth in their faith communities; 2) Train participants in a simple, conversational method for saving the life of someone considering suicide or companioning those impacted by suicidal desperation; and 3) Provide participants with an experience that models good relational skills and fosters confidence in their ability to make a difference.

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


