

During this disruptive year, I found myself turning to Arianne Braithwaite Lehn's Ash & Starlight: Prayers for the Chaos & Grace of Daily Life when I found myself at a loss for words, which was quite often this past year. One line that caught my attention recently was in her prayer for Lent. After a moment of confession, she writes, "But, I'm coming back home."

This line caught me off guard since it isn't usually what follows after our confessions in worship. Typically, after a moment of silent confession, we ask for

God to forgive us. We trust that God is gracious and loving, but nonetheless, we still ask. Yet, this prayer skips the plea for forgiveness and boldly claims "I'm coming back home."

Honestly, I have to say I like this response more. There is this healthy mix of humble recognition of how we've missed the mark and a sense of daring hope behind it. It reminds me of the parable of the prodigal son - when the youngest son has reached his lowest point, his first thoughts are of returning home. Despite what he has done, despite what has happened, he holds on to the hope that there is still a place for him at his father's home. So he humbly returns home, and sure enough, he is welcomed by a loving embrace.

I believe that same hope is what's at the center of this Lenten season: no matter who we are, no matter what happens, God lovingly welcomes us home time and time again. With that good news at its center, this season invites us to make the journey back home - back to our true selves, back to each other, back to God.

While confession and forgiveness are a part of such a journey (and are practices we should probably turn to more often during these divisive times), I believe there is more to it this time around. As we continue to journey through this wilderness that is this pandemic, we are invited to name and let go (when possible) all that prevents us from feeling at home with ourselves, in the presence of our neighbors, and in the presence of God. We are invited to turn to practices - both old and new - that help create a sense of home in our lives again. And we are invited to keep an eye out for how God might be transforming our sense of home into something new.

To help with that journey this Lenten season, I've invited our youth to join me in cultivating a rhythm of prayer using a set of daily devotional cards created by Sanctified Art. Starting with Ash Wednesday and going through Easter Sunday, we will select a card each day and contemplate the word printed, trusting that it is exactly what we need for that moment. Then we're encouraged to read the short scripture, reflection prompts, and prayer on the back. I invite you all to join us in in this practice this season! It is my hope for us all that these devotional cards, or whatever practices we might turn to, help us with our journey back home this season. And may we all feel God's loving embrace upon our return.



Adult Education

Programs planned and scheduled for 2021 offer exciting new opportunities for growth and learning, as well as continuation of traditional programs we have been blessed with for years.

January ended with the completion on January 21 of the last two sessions of the Thursday evening Reflections series on the Basic Tenets of our Reformed Faith.

Starting January 28, the Thursday evening Reflections course, led by the Presbyterian Outlook, will use a new six-week curriculum published last year by PCUSA called "Testimony." This course will explore the core values of the Christian faith and provide tools to help enable us and our communities to live out those values. Our regular Bible Study programs will resume virtually via Zoom until Covid restrictions on in-person meetings are lifted.


They include:

- Hopefully, "Show Up and Make," combining arts and crafts projects with worship, will be able to have a session later in the year.

With this wide array of offerings, we encourage participation by members and non-members alike in exploring and deepening their faith.

COMING HOME PROGRAM




This is a reminder that the decision has been made not to hold our Coming Home program in 2021 due to the continuing pandemic.

For the first half of February, we will finish off our focus on embodying the message of the Lord's Prayer in our daily lives. Starting on Sunday, February 21, the first Sunday of Lent, we will switch over to Illustrated Ministry's *An Illustrated Lent: Reflections on the Heart*. By exploring Gospel passages about treasures and matters of the heart, we will wonder more deeply about what kinds of treasure matter, why we store treasures, and the power these treasures have in our lives. Each week we will focus on a different theme:


Worship

Rye Presbyterian Nursery School

Greetings to the RPC Community from Kristin Bassett Kumar

One of our four-year-old classes is studying space. This month, the class is focusing on the moon. The children made craters by pressing rocks in a playdough moon surface.



They also worked on a science experiment when creating a moon volcano. The children added baking soda, vinegar, dish soap, and food coloring and watched in amazement at the chemical reaction!



The class worked together in the art studio to create a model of the moon. They made a rubbing of different size coins and circle shapes placed under aluminum foil. The effect looked like the millions of craters on the moon! The children learned about the moon orbiting around the Earth and about the different phases of the moon including the new moon, crescent moon, and the full moon. The children learned that it looks like the moon is changing shape, but it really is not! We are seeing different parts of its bright, silvery surface.



The class also created a space pattern – star, planet, star, planet.... Early math skills include recognizing and completing patterns. Children learn how to predict what comes next when working with patterns.



The children as so excited to learn more about space as their investigation continues!
