Will you let it be a Prayer or a Litany?

Did you know that Christmas doesn't end on December 25? On Friday, January 6, 2023 the Advent/Christmas season concludes with the Epiphany of the Lord, or Three Kings Day. It is when we celebrate the arrival of the Magi as recorded in Matthew 2:1-12. January 6 is also known as the twelfth day of Christmas, counting from December 25. One of the most powerful reflections about the passing of this season was written by Howard Thurman, an African-American theologian, educator, and civil rights leader. The poem, entitled "The Work of Christmas" is from Howard Thurman's *The Mood of Christmas and Other Celebrations*.

"The Work of Christmas"



When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among the people, to make music in the heart.

Some have called this a poem. Others refer to Thurman's work as a prayer, a prayer that should be on our lips and in our hearts. Some suggest that a prayer is talking to God, invoking God, or asking for a blessing from God. If this is the case, then I prefer what others have called this poem – a liturgy.

According to James White (*Introduction to Christian Worship*) the word "liturgy" comes from the Greek *leito-urgia* and is composed of the words "work and people". In ancient Greece, a liturgy was a public work performed for the benefit of the city or state. Liturgy, then, is a work performed by the people for the benefit of others. In other words, it is the quintessence of the priesthood of believers that the whole priestly community of Christians shares.

So I ask, as we move into 2023, will we use Thurmond's "The Work of Christmas" simply as a prayer upon our lips? Or might his powerful poem become for us a New Year Liturgy – our works performed for the benefit of others? I invite you to join me with the liturgy of your life in 2023 –




to find the lost,

COMING HOME IS Coming Back!



We are excited to announce that our **COMING HOME** program **IS** coming back. The program will relaunch next month, beginning on Thursday, February 2. If you aren't familiar with COMING HOME, it is an extension of our long-standing Prison Ministry at Rye Presbyterian Church. The program seeks to empower those who are returning to the community from incarceration. The 18-week program pairs RPC congregants with the formerly incarcerated to help them transition back into the community. Teaching sessions and a shared meal are on Thursday evenings and will conclude with graduation on Sunday, June 4.

This ministry offers several volunteer opportunities, including serving as mentors, who are paired with participants, supporting and encouraging them during the course of the program; as well as cooks who prepare and serve a meal enjoyed by the participants and RPC congregants who share table fellowship together. We hope that you consider volunteering to once again make Rye Presbyterian Church a place of welcome to those who are return-



ing home from prison. 
