



40. Maybe it is me, but it seems to show up quite often – in the Bible and elsewhere. A quarantine? From the Italian for 40 – during the bubonic plague it was the number of days a ship had to remain in the Venice harbor before landing. 40 days of rain on Noah and his family in the ark. 40 years for the people of Israel in the wilderness as they exit from Egypt into the Promised Land. Moses spends 40 days with God on Mt. Sinai before returning with the commandments. Goliath taunts the armies of Israel for 40 days before David emerges to save the day. After his baptism, Jesus spends 40 days in the wilderness before beginning his ministry. WD-40? The fortieth “water displacement” formula tried by scientists that finally worked! Pregnancy... 40 weeks. 40 days in Lent.

Is that all just random? Maybe it is. Maybe we could find similar occurrences for just about any number. But at least in the Bible the number 40 surfaces repeatedly. Perhaps it is just a poetic way of saying “a long time.” But almost always it represents a time of waiting and a time of preparation. It is time of testing and clarification before a new chapter begins. It is enough time for some actual change to take place. It seems to be part of God’s way.

As we prepare to enter the third Lent of this pandemic, perhaps it is time to enter Lent more fully – and more intentionally. The last two Lents felt more forced upon us. As one meme put it regarding Lent 2020 – “I had no idea I was going to have to give up so much for Lent.” This year, with hope, it is a different situation with a new hopeful chapter coming before us. And as we look at the potential end of this wilderness time, there are decisions to be made. How will we live in that new chapter? Who will we be in that chapter? What lessons of the last two years have we learned? What will we leave behind as we enter the new? What will we take in and invest ourselves? What direction will we go?

These are among the many deeper spiritual questions that are before us. The 40 days of Lent offer us a unique opportunity to enter those questions more fully and more intentionally. In so doing, it goes beyond “giving up” something for the next 40 days. Taking a break from chocolate may be fine and may in fact be a good idea. That probably depends on your current chocolate

habits. Less gaming for 40 days? Probably a good thing as well. But with what will we fill our spirits and our increasingly precious time in the absence of such things? Do our choices help us align more fully with the One who created us and calls us to lives of integrity, generosity and service? Do they lead us further into the truth of who we were made to be and how we are to live our lives?

40 days. Let’s try it. Let’s linger a little longer in that place where God has met God’s people for hundreds of years. Re-center. Re-focus. A new chapter lies ahead.

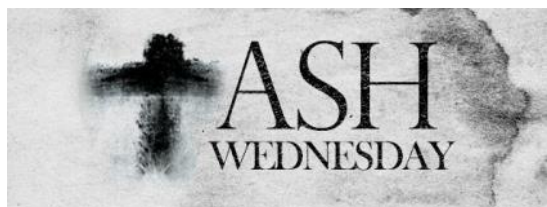


THE DAVIDSON GORDON QUIET SERVICE AWARD

Since the early days of Rye Presbyterian Church, members have generously recognized the church in their estate plans, resulting in important support for our programs and for the maintenance of our facilities. Having recently marked the 150th anniversary of our sanctuary, we believe now is the time to invite our members to consider making this type of gift to Rye Presbyterian Church. Called Planned or Legacy Giving, it differs from our regular annual stewardship campaign. Instead, it looks to the future in helping to fund the church's endowment. It can include naming the church in a will or trust document, or adding the church as a beneficiary under a retirement plan or insurance policy. Other ways of giving include donating real estate or other assets no longer needed by your family or by creating a charitable trust that can provide income to you during your life and benefit the church at a later date. The decision to explore these types of gifts is a personal one and should be structured to fit your own situation.

Rye Presbyterian Nursery School

Greetings to the RPC Community from Kristin Bassett Kumar

In February, the classes celebrated the Lunar New Year. They read books to learn about how many people prepare for and celebrate the new year. They also learned that each year has an animal assigned to it and that this is the Year of the Tiger. The children made paper lanterns by decorating red paper with gold paint. They then cut lines in the folded paper and connected the ends to complete their lanterns.

During circle time, the teachers shared the story of the Chinese Zodiac using animal puppets as props. After the children were familiar with the story, the puppets and numbered animal cards were placed in the math center for the children to explore independently. To tell the story, the children needed to reference the numbered cards and put the animals in order. This was a fun way to incorporate language skills, literacy, and math as we practiced recognizing and ordering numbers.

The children also learned that during Lunar New Year, it is bad luck to write anything in red. All week, the children gathered any red writing utensils and added them to a jar in our classroom. At the end of the week, we played an estimation game to estimate how many red writing utensils were found.
