

The Alleluias of Easter Sunday are past. Baskets with fake grass and rabbit figurines have been packed away until next year. Easter is past. Or is it? In the church liturgical calendar we are now in the season known as Eastertide. It is the 50 days between Easter Sunday and Pentecost Sunday. And, in fact, each of the Sundays between these two celebrations is referred to as Sundays of Easter. Eastertide is an ancient and widespread practice. In the first few centuries, Christians marked special events that occurred between Christ's resurrection and the formative events on Pentecost (which means "fiftieth day" in Greek).

There is no scriptural requirement for us to celebrate Easter for fifty days, or even one day, for that matter. But there is nothing in the Bible that would prohibit joyful remembrance of the resurrection for any length of time. In fact, there is much to commend the practice of celebrating Eastertide. For the resurrection of our Lord changes everything. "The implications of the resurrection lavishly overflow a one-day container," Mark Roberts notes in his invitation to celebrate Eastertide. It leads us to ask: "How can we worship God in light of the resurrection?" "How do we experience the reality of our own resurrection from death to life through the grace of God in Christ?" "How might we live for fifty days—and beyond—as resurrection people?"

During Lent a group of us explored Adam Hamilton's book, *Unafraid*. In the chapter entitled, "I'm Not Ready to Die," Hamilton writes: "It was C. S. Lewis who once said that what we believe about death and the afterlife fundamentally changes how we live this life. If I believe that the Gospel writers and the apostles were telling the truth, and that Jesus died and rose again (as astounding as that may seem), and if I trust the words of Jesus himself about death and the afterlife, then I can face all of life... with courage and hope." Later he concludes by saying, "People ask me from time to time, 'Adam, you seem intelligent. Do you *really* believe this stuff? That Jesus rose from the dead? That we live after death with God in heaven?' My answer is always the same. 'I not only believe it, I'm counting on it."

And so during these days of Eastertide I invite you to be looking for resurrection all around us. You may experience it in creation as the plants and trees and flowers come into full bloom. You may experience it in a personal relationship that is mended and restored and given new life. You may experience in the midst of worship or in the simple silence of your own daily devotional life.

I have always liked what Frederick Buechner wrote about Easter: "The symbol of Easter is the empty tomb. You can't depict or domesticate emptiness. You can't make it into pageants and string it with lights. It doesn't move people to give presents to each other or sing old songs. It ebbs and flows all around us, the Eastertide... He rose. A few saw him briefly and talked to him. If it is true, there is nothing left to say. If it is not true, there is nothing left to say. For believers and unbelievers both, life has never been the same again. For some, neither has death..." Happy Eastertide!

# **Baby Box Project**

It's hard to believe that in the wealthiest county on earth, there are parents who wonder how they are going to feed, house and care for their children. Open Door Family Medical Center is our community's health home for these people.

Please join our partnership with Open Door Family Medical Center to support new moms giving their babies a healthy and safe start in life.

**The Collection:** Join us May 5<sup>th</sup> through June 9<sup>th</sup> collecting items to make Baby Boxes for the moms and their babies. What's a <u>Baby Box</u>? It's a remarkably designed cardboard box filled with newborn basics that include a waterproof mattress and cotton sheet so the box can be used as the baby's first bed or bassinet.

There are Baby Boxes on display in the Chapel Foyer, the hall outside the first floor Welcome Office and in the RPNS entrance way. There are many things a newborn may need and Open Door has created an **Amazon Wish List** and **BuyBuyBaby** Registry. If you would like to personally shop for just the right items, here is what they recommend: sleep sacks, sleep and play bodysuits, newborn hats, mittens, socks digital rectal thermometers, baby ointment, diapers and wipes, infant toys and books. Arcade Books has partnered with us again this year to have bilingual board books available. Please drop off your donations in any of the empty Baby Boxes during our month long drive.


