## Blessed to be a Blessing

part 2

One year ago, back in what felt like a different universe, I wrote an article here in this space regarding our annual stewardship campaign, and the plans for a new window in the sanctuary - the Abraham and Sarah window. A year later, amid an enormous amount of change and disruption, some things remain the same, and some things come to fruition.

First of all, the window. Last spring, plans

for the new Abraham and Sarah window were approved by the church Session as a part of celebrating 150 years since the building of our sanctuary in 1870. The new window will depict Abraham and Sarah, their slave-girl Hagar, and Ishmael and Isaac – their whole complicated family portrait. They are very human (and very flawed) "heroes" of the faith, who model for us faith and faithfulness – trusting God's promise to them even amid circumstances that often challenge them to believe otherwise. And despite their stumbling, they step boldly into an unknown future, trusting, as it says in Genesis 12 and will say in the new window, that God will bless them, and God will make them to be a blessing to all families of the earth.

As it says in the stewardship letter that you should have received recently, there is a clear connection between their story and ours. We, too, live in disrupted and anxious times. The future before us is unknown, and for many, a cause for fear. Yet we, too, are called to trust. God still speaks to us as God did to Abraham and Sarah. I will bless you, God says. And through you I will bless all the families of the earth. It is a promise that we need to hear today, and that future generations at RPC will undoubtedly need to hear as well in whatever circumstances they find themselves.

But it is also an invitation. We are invited to join in this grand plan of God's in which God seeks to bless again all of creation. Like the parts of the window that even now are being pieced together in Rohlf's stained glass studio in Mount Vernon, we are invited to be a part of this amazing, unlikely, and beautiful work that God is up to. We are blessed. Even with all that we face in this time, we know that. And in that blessing, we are all invited to live in a way that blesses others – each of us a unique bit of glass through which God's love and generosity and goodness can shine through - all of us joined

together, even in our separateness, to embody the blessing for others.

The artist's rendition of the new window is on the 2021 pledge card that came in your mail recently. The picture here on the cover is of that artist's dream becoming reality – the actual pieces of glass being fit together to form the robe of Abraham. His face is still a work in progress! But soon the window will be completed and put in place to be a blessing to us and to all who enter the RPC sanctuary for the next 150 years and beyond. On your pledge card, in addition to thoughtfully considering your pledge for the coming year, you are invited to give toward this new window.

With Stewardship Commitment Sunday coming up on November 22<sup>nd</sup>, and as we all fill out our pledge cards, may we see that act as more than just a way to make budget for the coming year. Instead, may it be a part of this much larger vision that calls and invites us to faith and faithfulness – our faces each looking out through that place in Abraham's robe where his face will be soon. May God's stunning vision for an entire world richly blessed become a step more real through each and every one of us.





#### Chapel Organ Installation Delayed—Begins November 4


The delivery of the new pipe organ for the chapel was delayed until November 4, this due to pandemic guidelines, restrictions, and quarantine requirements that were put into effect just two days prior to the delivery that had been planned for October 1. In some ways, such a snafu was not unexpected. Technicians will be on-site through November 25 in order to install all of the organ's components and to finish the voicing and regulation of each pipe.

#### Steinway "D" Refurbishment

As the new chapel organ's delivery and installation was been delayed, we moved ahead with a planned refurbishment of the great Steinway "D" concert grand piano that is in the sanctuary. Built in 1981, this piano had an initial refurbishment in 1994, when the church received it as a gift from Susan and Dod Fraser. Now, 26 years later (and being nearly 40 years old), the piano is due for another refurbishment. New felts, strings, and keytops are a part of the plan, as well as regulation of the key action and overall adjustments. The soundboard and the harp are in excellent condition. This renewed instrument will be even more of a joy to hear and to play!






