

Your pastors normally use this front page of *Grace Notes* to share with you words of reflection, challenge, encouragement, and inspiration. With this September 2022 issue I want to do something a bit different.

First, on behalf of all three of your pastors, I want to invite you to join us for worship under the tent on Sunday, September 11, at 10:00 a.m. It is our prayer that as we move into the fall, many more of you will "fall back" into the pre-Covid lifestyle of engaging in the life and ministry of our congregation. Join us for worship, Sunday School, youth groups, Confirmation, choirs, bible and book studies, and a whole host of other experiences where you can get to know others within our church as well as grow in your faith!

Second, I want to share with you an update about our new All Souls Community Center so that it, too, may serve as a reflection, challenge, encouragement, and inspiration. Late 2020, as it became clear that the All Souls Presbyterian Church congregation would be dissolving, I shared with Dan and a few others my dream of the possibility of the All Souls Presbyterian Church facilities being used by our congregation for continuing outreach and ministry in the Port Chester community. In January 2021 our officers began an earnest discussion about this possibility. By mid-2021 a plan for Rye Presbyterian to acquire the All

Souls facility was developed. After many discussions and much prayer, this plan was approved by the former All Souls congregation, by our congregation, and by Hudson River Presbytery. We then needed court approval for the sale to take place. All of this happened and in June of 2022, Rye Presbyterian Church took legal possession of the All Souls church facility and manse. We also created a transition team that has been working on the transition process.

Upon reflection, this process has taken a significant amount of time and energy to come together. But here's the thing – we're now just at the beginning! How would God have us be stewards of this facility? How might we best continue to serve the Port Chester community, as we have done for decades through other community agencies and partners? These are both challenging and exciting times!

Currently we have use agreements with two nesting congregations (a Seventh Day Adventist congregation and a Spanish speaking Pentecostal congregation); Food to Grow On (a weekly feeding program); 5 Steps to Five (a program helping parents to prepare their babies for success in school); and a local Alcoholics Anonymous group. This past July we also hosted the preschool aged camp program for the Village of Port Chester Recreation Dept. Also in July, working in cooperation with several other Westchester county organizations, we signed an agreement and welcomed a Ukrainian refugee family into the manse for the next year.

As you read this I hope you will be encouraged and inspired by what is taking place at 55 Parkway Drive in Port Chester, our new All Souls Community Center. I also pray that you will share with our church leadership what visions you may have about how we can best steward this facility; and when the time comes, that you will join us in some form of hands-on service at All Souls. We look forward to seeing you on September 11 and someday soon at our second campus in Port Chester.



Peace & Global Witness Offering, Confirmation 2022

The Peace and Global Witness Offering (to be received on Sunday, October 2)



The words of Isaiah 55 convey a profound message to us: For you shall go out in joy, and be led forth in peace.

Go out in joy. When we look around our world these days, it is sometimes hard to feel joyful. Yet joy inherently embraces optimism. Joy is the companion of faith and hope. In our polarized world torn by war, famine, and marginalization of the poor and disenfranchised, we are in desperate need of joyful and brave people who are willing to ask the hard questions and live the difficult solutions that make peace possible.

Be led forth in peace. Through the Peace & Global Witness Offering, we connect with each other, as the Church, together, to confront systems of injustice and promote reconciliation in places around the world and here at home.

Through our gifts to the Peace & Global Witness Offering, we are able to participate in this larger work that we would not be able to do on our own. Because this is a shared Offering, we can help those whose challenges are very present to us. 25% of the Offering will stay with our own congregation to pursue peacemaking and reconciliation ministries. In the October issue of *Grace Notes* we will share how the 25% we retain will be used. 25% stays with our mid council (Hudson River Presbytery) for work in our region. And 50% will be used at the national level for ministries of peacemaking and global witness. Remember — peace is active, not passive. Peace is doing, not waiting. So let us go out in joy and be led forth in peace.

Please give whatever you can. For when we all do a little, it adds up a lot.

(The Peace and Global Witness Offering is one of the four special offerings of the Presbyterian Church (USA) that we receive each year.)



Confirmation 2023

If God is so good... why do bad things happen? What do all those stories in the Bible have to do with me? How can science fit with what is taught in church? What makes Christianity different?

This month, the confirmation class of 2023 will begin its exploration of these questions and many more as we explore the bible story and the life of faith together. Not every ninth grader may be asking these questions or eager to take on extra work as high school begins. Yet Confirmation class is a unique opportunity to explore the life of faith at an important reflection point in your own life journey.

To begin the year, following worship on Sunday, September 18, there will be an informational meeting for those considering Confirmation and their parents in the Westminster Room. All ninth graders and at least one parent are encouraged to come to this brief meeting regardless of eagerness, willingness, doubts, or questions!

Again this year, the class will meet throughout the year, and will be active in many aspects of the church, including the traditional duty as Sunday crucifer.


This year we'll start our time together as a class with a gathering on Sunday, September 25, at 5:00 p.m. in the Assembly Room.





Being Mortal, by Atul Gawande



In recent years our congregation and community has experienced several suicides. We have offered a variety of programing in response to these heartbreaking events. We encourage you to attend the 11/2 hour Soul Shop for Congregations workshop this fall. The workshop will be offered twice, on Sunday, Oct. 23, and on Tuesday evening, Oct. 25, but you only attend one of the sessions. This workshop will be led by John Miller and Jean-Paul Marshall. Soul Shop for Congregations has three objectives: 1) Familiarize participants with the incidence and impact of suicidal desperation on the adults and youth in their faith communities; 2) Train participants in a simple, conversational method for saving the life of someone considering suicide or companioning those impacted by suicidal desperation; and 3) Provide participants with an experience that models good relational skills and fosters confidence in their ability to make a difference.

Advance registration is highly encouraged. There is no cost.

Chancel Choir to Begin New Season; All High School Students Invited to Join

The Chancel Choir will resume its role in worship (10:00 a.m. service) on September 18. As part of a design to bring choir age groups into sync with Sunday School classes and Youth groups, all high school students now are invited (yea – welcome and encouraged) to sing as members of the Chancel Choir. JOIN THE CHANCEL CHOIR

RPC's music ministry thrives because many volunteers contribute their time and talent. Might you have interest in singing in the Chancel Choir? If so, please read on!

COVID-19 SAFETY NOTE: Masking and distancing will be implemented as

needed. Rehearsals will take place in spaces with fresh air induction and good air circulation. Singers are expected to stay current with booster vaccine recommendations from the CDC.

- The Chancel Choir, open to anyone who is a high school freshmen or older, sings each Sunday of the program year (mid-September through mid-June) and in services on Christmas Eve and Maundy Thursday.
- September 18 is the first Sunday of the 2022-2023 program year on which the choir will lift its voice in worship. A one-off first rehearsal, preceded by a potluck supper, will be held the evening of Thursday, September 15.
- The usual Sunday schedule begins with warm-up at 9:15 a.m., continues with singing in the 10:00 a.m. service, and concludes with a rehearsal following that service (11:15 a.m. 12:30 p.m.).
- Ability to read music makes for ease of progress; but, those who do not yet know the "language" of music, yet are able to match and maintain pitch, are most welcome to join.
- Section leaders (professional musicians) assist and help to inspire all singers.

Chapel Organ to Be Dedicated and Inaugurated on September 18

Mark your calendars and plan to be here on Sunday, September 18 as we will dedicate in worship the new pipe organ in the chapel and present concerts to inaugurate it. David von Behren, the associate organist and choirmaster of The Memorial Church at Harvard University, will offer works that highlight the new organ's resources. Included on the program will be Mr. von Behren's own arrangements for organ and simultaneous violin (he will play the violin with his hands while playing the organ with his feet — on the organ's pedal keyboard). The concerts (the same program will be offered twice in order to accommodate the limited seating in the chapel) will begin at 11:15 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. There is no admission charge.

David von Behren, a graduate of the Cleveland Institute of Music and Yale University, was appointed associate organist and choirmaster of The Memorial Church at Harvard University in 2019. A winner of numerous scholarships and awards (including a Jack Kent Cooke Young Artist Award, with a subsequent performance on NPR's *From the Top*), his connection to Rye Presbyterian Church is via having been a recipient (2016) of the church's Peter B. Knock Memorial Scholarship in Sacred Music. David returns each summer to his native Falls City, Nebraska, to continue the annual "Little Stars" Music Camp he founded while he was in high school.

The new organ in Crawford Chapel, built by the Canadian firm of Casavant Frères (the same company that built the present chancel organ), was installed in November 2020; but, the COVID pandemic delayed its regular use until this summer. It replaces a somewhat smaller-yet-similar instrument (also built by Casavant), installed in 1957, at the time the chapel and the adjoining education wing of the church were built. Advances in technology now provide the church a far more flexible instrument that speaks clearly into the resonant space.

Music Notes

Welcome to Collin Miller, the 2022-2023 Knock Intern in Sacred Music



Collin Miller, an incoming student in the Master of Musical Arts program of study at the Yale School of Music and the Institute of Sacred Music, will be the Peter B. Knock Intern in Sacred Music here for the 2022-2023 program year. Welcome, Collin!

Mr. Miller, a native of Lafayette, La., holds degrees in organ performance from Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music, where his principal teacher was Dr. Janette Fishell. Most recently, he has served as Organ Scholar of Christ Church Cathedral (Episcopal) in Indianapolis. Mr. Miller was the first-prize winner in the 2021 Arthur Poister Organ Competition and the 2017 Southwest Regional Competition of the American Guild of Organists. In addition, he was a finalist in the 2021 St. Albans International Organ Competition and was named by *The Diapason* magazine in 2019 to the "20 Under 30" Roster of rising organists.

The Peter B. Knock Intern in Sacred Music is an outgrowth of the Peter B. Knock Scholarship, an award that was given from 1991 to 2016 to promising organists whose career path was leading them to work in the field of sacred music.

Next, a New Chancel Was Built and the Organ and the Choir Were Moved There (Continuing from the June 2022 newsletter)

As the church continued to grow and wider liturgical reforms came about (moving from the centrality of the pulpit to the equality of the pulpit (with supplemental lectern), font, and table, the need and desire for more and re-ordered space gained ground. Thus, in 1947 the current chancel was built (replacing the 1870 apse).




The new chancel was appointed thus: The Hillgreen, Lane & Co. organ was moved from the balcony into the chamber above and adjacent to the current pulpit. The Communion Table and the Deacons chairs were moved to the east wall of the chancel, underneath the new Great Window, abutting the reredos (which was affixed to the east wall). Pews for the choir were placed perpendicular to and behind the lectern and the pulpit (in what is known as the "Collegiate style"). The organ console was approximately where the current organ's console is now, except that it was turned 90 degrees so that the organist's back was toward the east wall. A series of small mirrors was affixed to small, adjustable panels in the reredos behind the pulpit, this to enable the singers on the lectern side to see/be conducted by the organist (who was sitting behind them). The modesty rail portions next to the pulpit and the lectern were longer (extending more into the center of the chancel), this to provide some definition of space for the choir and to create a wide aisle in the chancel that led to the Communion Table.

New chancel not quite finished (1947). Note the four small panels above back choir pew (those had the mirrors) and note the electric wiring waiting for the chandeliers to be installed (those chandeliers are now in the Assembly Room).






