Confirmation class for young (and not-so-young)



This fall marks the twenty-second year that I have been involved in leading and teaching the RPC Confirmation Class since I began with the class of 1998. By my math, that is 577 young people that have taken the journey from September to May, and from Genesis to Revelation, as we have explored the nature, meaning, and practice of the Christian faith. It remains one of the highlights of my year and my ministry – a chance to think out loud about what really matters within all there is to know about the bible, faith, church history, and RPC life. It is also a chance to think together anew about how that faith speaks amid ever-changing realities of life and the lives of our youth.

As near as I can tell from the RPC records, Confirmation has not always been a part of the life of the church. This summer, in preparation for the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the RPC sanctuary in 2020, I spent some time going back through the history of the church and its records. There are amazing hand-written lists of



members dating back to the 1860's, and list of elders, deacons, trustees, weddings, and baptisms from about 1920. Near as I can tell, Confirmation for young people began in the 1940s. In some

years, especially during the post-war church boom, confirmation classes were as big as 80 students. In recent years, we had a high of 45 in the class of 2010, with an average of 26 during my years here.

Perhaps you are curious - what do we study during the year? My main goal throughout this year is for the class to gain a sense of the overarching narrative of the biblical story - the story of God's intentional relationship with humanity and the world. We begin with the story of creation, and wrestle with how to understand and appreciate the bible – for what it says, and what it does not say. We follow the story through the "fall" of Adam and Eve, and through God's many efforts throughout the Jewish faith story to "set things right." We then pick up with the story of Jesus – his life, teachings, and final week – and what that means for the larger story of God. We follow the story through the birth of the church right up to present day – to each one of us. Which leads us to the most important question that each student puts on paper in their statement of faith at the end of the year: how do I fit in this large, grand, sometimes baffling, but amazing story of God and God's people?

But you don't have to let that last paragraph be the end of your curiosity. This fall, beyond the class that John, Jean-Paul, and I will be teaching with the 9<sup>th</sup> graders, I will also be leading an evening "refresher" course for adults based on the confirmation curriculum. For more information, please take a look in the Adult Education section of this issue of Grace Notes. You are invited!

Even if you can't come on Tuesday evenings, I invite you to join the confirmation class as they commit to the confirmation process in the coming year by committing yourself to concrete steps to grow in your faith this fall. There are three opportunities for worship each weekend, and myriad other ways to engage in study, service, and fellowship as we seek to grow together in faith and to see how our life stories are a part of the amazing ongoing story that God is writing – even now.

## **NOLA 2019 MISSION TRIPS**

Between both June and August, RPC commissioned 25 high school youth, along with chaperones, to travel to New Orleans on our youth mission trips. Once again this year, we sent two groups - thanks to the generous support of the congregation through the Imagine Initiative, as well as the Women's Association, the Mission & Outreach committee, and a few generous angel investors. On both trips we partnered with Rebuilding Together, a terrific group that focuses on improving the quality of life through home improvements for those who are elderly, disabled, or veterans. In June, we split into two groups, with one prepping and painting classrooms for a local school's Opportunity Academy and the other working on siding repair and exterior painting for a house in the Hollygrove neighborhood. In August, the group mostly scraped and primed a house in the St. Claude neighborhood. We worked hard, and we played hard with visits to the Katrina Museum, beignets in the French Quarter, some AAA baseball, street art and music tours, and a great evening at the Rock 'n' Bowl!

In addition to the support and prayers of the church, we particularly thank our non-staff chaperones this year - Heather Miller, Susie Marshall, and Margaret and Jonathan Blum - all gave generously of their summer to be a part of the trips!

This year we'll start our time together as a class with a pizza dinner at the church on Sunday, September 22, at 5:00 p.m. in the Assembly Room.

Race and how to talk about it is a major subject of our social, political, and theological discourse. This is important and challenging work that the Church of Jesus is called to be engaged in.

For 25 years, members of RPC have been involved in ever increasing, broadening, and deepening ways in work with individuals who are, or have been incarcerated and

others impacted, by the criminal justice system. In that time, our beloved church has become a leader in prison ministry in our Presbytery and beyond.


Here are the many ways **you** can become involved in this lifechanging work:


• **Prison Visitation:** We meet with a group of Masters students on the third Sunday of each month at Sing Sing in Ossining, leaving around 5:00 p.m. and returning home around 9:15 p.m. We have room for one more within our limit of 10 people and would welcome your interest. We also meet with a highly motivated group at Fishkill in Beacon on the second Sunday of each month leaving around 11:20 a.m. and returning around 4:30 p.m. We have room for several more RPCers in this group. Contact information is same as above.

- Clothes Closet: If you have men's suits or other clothes you no longer need (or don't fit), you can donate them to a "Clothes Closet" we maintain in the church to enable men, who often have no clothing other than their prison garb, to have proper business attire in their employment search and other clothes for daily living. - Coming Home: Prison ministry doesn't end when an incarcerated person is released. RPC offers an 18-week program to those recently released providing mentoring, help with

resumes and job search, and simply acclimating to life on the outside. Each week you are invited to a dinner to share a meal with program participants, to enable all of us to know and understand one another better, and to enjoy a joyful time of fellowship. No reservations required!





• Leadership Beyond: Because of RPC's creativity and commitment to prison ministry, we have led our Presbytery's efforts to expand this ministry to other churches. And we helped develop and launch two programs that for many years have provided educational opportunities in prisons throughout New York: in Rising Hope, a Certificate in Ministry program modeled after the Masters program, now operating in six prisons around New York; and Hudson Link, now a 20-year-old, fully accredited, privately funded college program in eight New York prisons and the model for similar programs around the country.

As you can see, RPC provides multiple platforms for involvement in prison ministry. We hope the number of congregants who are part of this ministry, in small or larger ways, will continue to grow in the years ahead.


The RPC Women's Association will hold its first fall meeting on Monday, September 9, from 9:00-10:00 a.m. in the Library.
